Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Stewardship Sunday

"No servant can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon."

The Lord's exhortation that "you cannot serve God and wealth" can be difficult to swallow. In order to foster a healthy attitude towards our wealth, it is important to view it, and our very lives themselves, as a gift from God. When we view our wealth as a gift we can then begin to move from gratitude to generosity, graciously sharing our gifts with others for the glory of God and the church.

We invite you to read Cardinal Thomas Collins' Pastoral Letter on Stewardship. The letter is both a reflective guide and an urgent exhortation for Catholics to be aware of God's gracious gifts and to live fully, gratefully, in service to others.

The letter unpacks the meaning of **"deep stewardship" in everyday Christian life**: the acknowledgment that we have received everything from God, and are "asked to make good use of what has been entrusted to us" with "creativity and boldness" while regularly examining how we use the gifts God has given us.

In light of the Pastoral Plan, stewardship challenges us to a deeper conversion, both as individuals, and as a community, to give generously of our time, talent, and treasure, and to be totally, joyfully engaged in discipleship in both our parish home and the wider community as a whole.

The Pastoral Letter is organized into four sections: The Meaning of Stewardship, The Spirituality of Deep Stewardship, Reasons to Become Involved with Stewardship, and The Way Forward.

There are copies of the Pastoral Letter in the foyer of the church, on the bulletin board, and on our website.

You will also find a Volunteer Sign-up sheet in the bulletin. We ask that you prayerfully consider donating your time and talents to one or more of the many ministries that are in our parish.

"Stewardship is undeniably fruitful. Where, over time, more and more parishioners become engaged in committing their time, talent, and treasure to the work of the Gospel, the Church flourishes."

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD **SHEPHERD**


The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program will begin again in St. Leonard's Parish from October-May. Registration will be next
