If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

# Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A)

The Pharisees went off and plotted how they might entrap him in speech. They sent their disciples to him, with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are a truthful man and that you teach the way of God in accordance with the truth. And you are not concerned with anyone's opinion, for you do not regard a person's status. Tell us, then, what is your opinion: Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" Matthew 22:15-17

The lesson learned from this passage is an especially important one to apply to family life. It is very common for conflicts to arise from time to time among those who are close to each other. When that happens, we can often take the approach of trying to trap the other person and trip them up with our deceptive reasoning. When this happens between two people, the conversation often turns into a shouting match with each party seeking only to find fault with the other. The solution to such situations is simple. Every conflict must be resolved by the truth. Jesus did this perfectly. He did not attack when He was attacked. He did not defend Himself irrationally. He did not shy away from the confrontation. He did not manipulate the truth to His own advantage. Instead, He spoke openly and honestly the full truth and refused to engage his opponents in their trickery.

Oftentimes, when we feel as though another person is trying to trap us, condemn us, or challenge us, we become more concerned about our defense than with the honest truth. We can become afraid to say anything that will give them reason to attack us. We will be tempted to twist our answers rather than speak forthrightly with sincerity and honesty. This will never resolve a conflict. The only way to resolve anything is with the truth.

### **HIGHLIGHT ON MINISTRIES**

"Lord make me an instrument of your peace" (St. Francis) Are you interested in bringing Communion to the sick and homebound?



A **Pastoral Visitor** is a person who has taken a pastoral visitor workshop and has been installed by a parish priest. He/she has a relationship with God and understands and respects the faith of the sick person, and his or her family.

Visiting the sick is considered a serious pastoral responsibility. In response to the need for spiritual and emotional support to complement medical care, they visit people in their homes, nursing homes, and the hospital, providing a link with their church and offering the compassion and support of the faith community.

They are commissioned by God to visit the sick and bring His Body to them. He loves and forgives them and knows their sufferings. The greatest gift we can offer them is our presence.

If you think you might be called to this ministry, you will need to have approval of the Pastor, fill out volunteer screening forms, and complete a background check. You must take a workshop and be installed by the Pastor.
